How to help at home



Reading

Reading is very good for children's development and supports them in all lessons. We want to encourage children to love and enjoy reading so please find time to read with your child regularly at home, and ask them questions to check their understanding. Your child can change their reading book at school on a Tuesday and a Friday.

Homework

Your child will receive their next home learning tasks on Friday. It will be set on Seesaw so when your child completes these tasks, take photos and upload them to Seesaw.
